

Oh, how I admire that elegant, wise and intelligent woman and by the same token, how I so appreciate the high regard I have for two superb organizations with which we have recently collaborated - the Lexington Center for Recovery and the Rockland Council on Alcoholism and Other Drug Dependence Inc.



These venerated organizations are our "book ends" in providing a service addressing the needs of children who have been impacted by family members coping with opioid addiction. This new program entitled "Rockland Alive Mentoring Program" is a wonderful and valuable enhancement to our 1 – 1 mentoring service! From the time of its inception in January of this year, BBBS staff members have received education and prevention trainings from those who work in a field of service that is frequently underrated and we are grateful to our partner agencies on the attack against opioids.

That said and knowing how critically important our organization truly is to the community and to the families that we serve through the unique 1-1 mentoring model, the court ordered visitation program and the multifarious programs provided to all those requesting BBBS services, we are thrilled with our committed collaborators that now include the Rockland Mental Health Association, The Rockland Department of Mental Health, Dominican College, Spring Valley High School, Ramapo School District, The Village of Haverstraw, The Center for Safety and Change, Rockland Family Court, Lexington Center for Recovery and Rockland Council on Alcoholism and Other Drug Dependence Inc.

The goal of our new Rockland Alive Mentoring Program is to match children and youth, ages 7 - 17 years of age, who have been impacted by a parent/family members' use of opioids or who themselves, have misused the drug, with trained, qualified volunteer adult mentors as research has shown that children living through debilitating emotional, economic, and social consequences stemming from the arrest, detention, and/or incarceration of a parent are considered most vulnerable for delinquency because they are the *invisible* "victims."

Through a thorough process of interviewing, screening of potential volunteers, and interviewing the children's parents/caregivers and the children themselves, youth are matched with mentors. Each mentor commits to provide at least 4 hours monthly of one-to-one time with the child to whom they are "matched." Our professional staff provides support to the relationship through regular contact with the parent/ caregivers, the youth, and the volunteer mentors.

That said, this is a wonderful opportunity for all adults looking to "give back" to the community in a way that is meaningful personally and socially in order that our county's children receive vital social and emotional support as studies show that children who have a Big Brother or Big Sister benefit tremendously from the experience as a key for life improvement and attitude change.

Please won't you take the time to think of becoming a member of our family by volunteering to become a mentor and find out how you can become a DEFENDER OF POTENTIAL, by attending one of our upcoming Volunteer Training Sessions?

I close with another quote from that great lady "Since you get more joy out of giving joy to others, you should put a good deal of thought into the happiness that you are able to give."


