Welcome to JUMP Program Director!

JUMP is a juvenile mentoring program with children from the ages of 7-14 held on Tuesday evenings from 6-7:30 at the Haverstraw REC Center. The primary objective of JUMP is to create a welcoming and inclusive environment for all of our mentees, and to encourage them to make positive decisions as they develop throughout their adolescence. Since the age group of our mentees falls directly in line with some of the primary years of development and influence in school, we aim to discuss topics that they are likely to encounter during their school day. Focus groups and activities are usually based around topics such as bullying, team building, personal responsibility/accountability, health, hygiene, and peer pressure. The program also has a strong focus on keeping the children active and healthy, bringing in guests such as Kid's Crossfit/Zumba instructors and Juvenile Diabetes speakers. Additionally, the program helps to inspire the children to use their critical thinking skills by I incorporating science experiments and problem solving activities such as making GAK and using UV light to detect germs on surfaces.

A SUNY Oneonta graduate, Janelle currently works as a Stem Cell Scientist for Regeneron Pharmaceuticals. Equally as passionate for giving back to the community as she if for science, Janelle volunteers for Big Brothers Big Sisters, Team Rubicon, and Soup Angels Soup Kitchen in Nyack as well as several other organizations. She has been vegan for one year and vegetarian for eight, and is the proud pet parent to four rescues: Chewie, Tux, Scooter, and Itty Bitty Kitty.
